The elves celebrated! They had finished all their work.

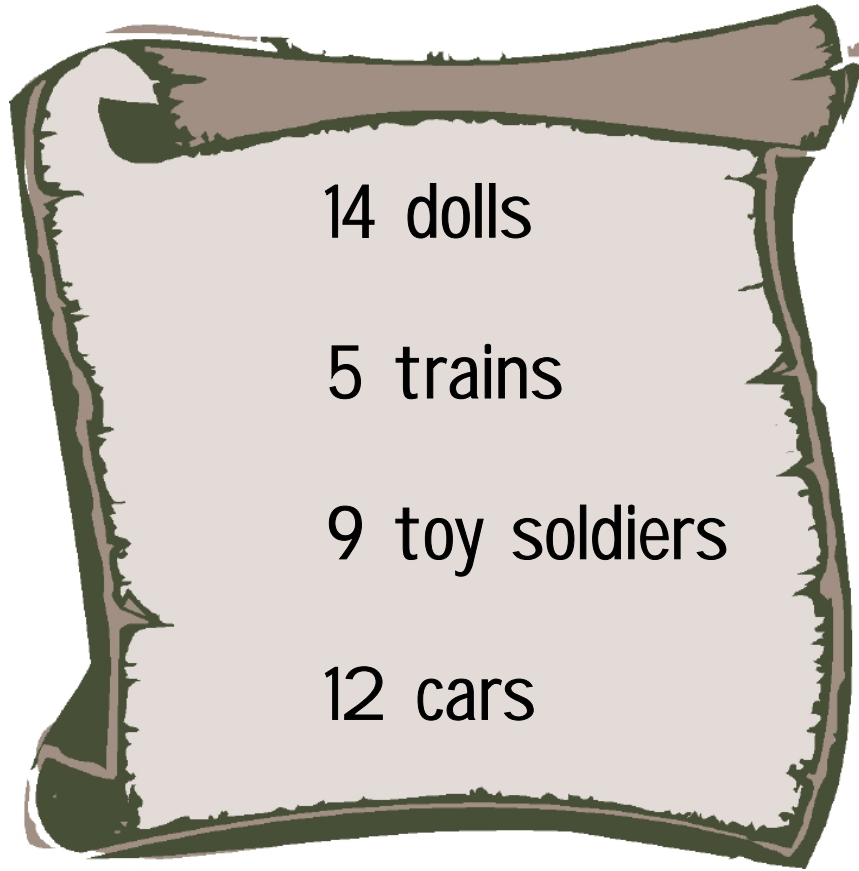
Color the picture below.

This is what the list said:



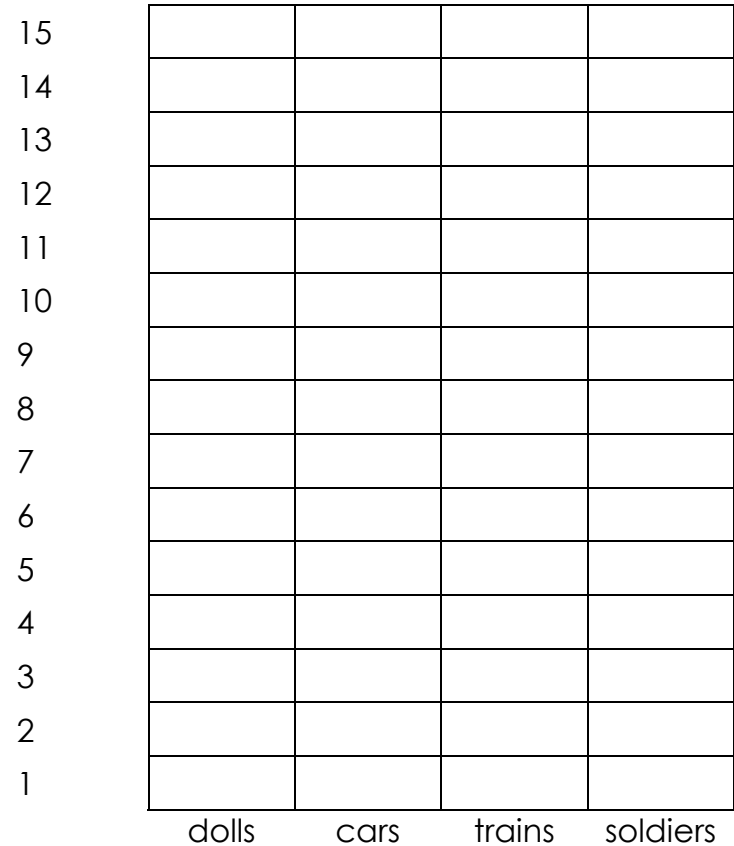

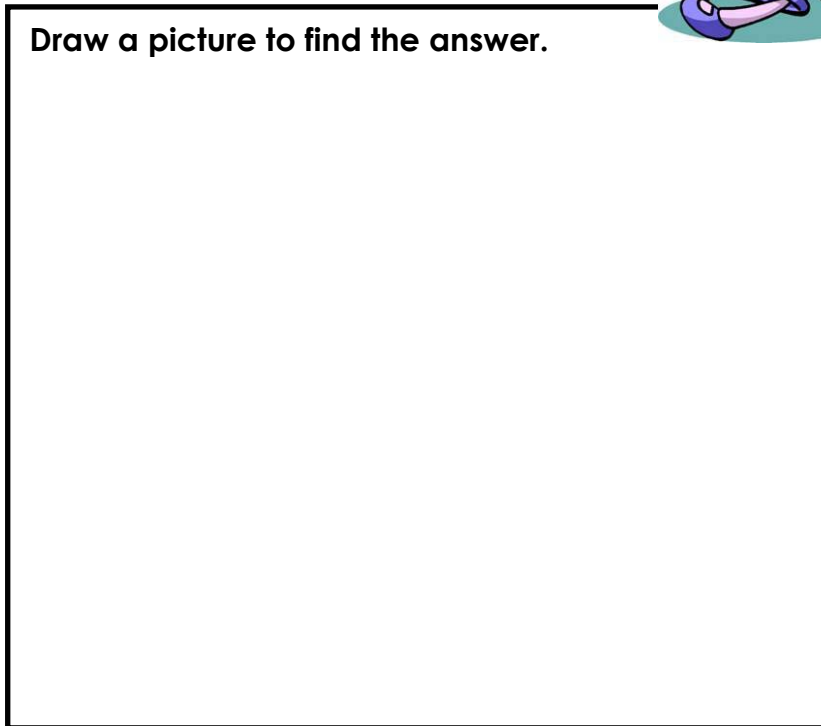

The elves began to work. By three o'clock, the elves had finished 10 dolls. How many more dolls did they need to make?



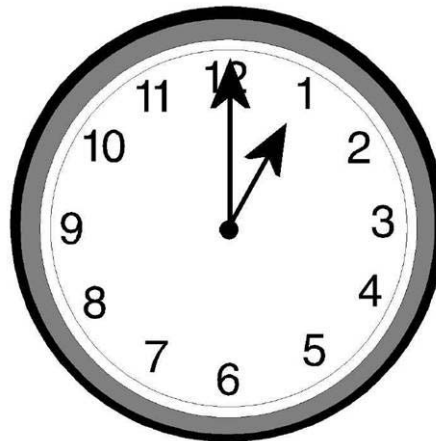

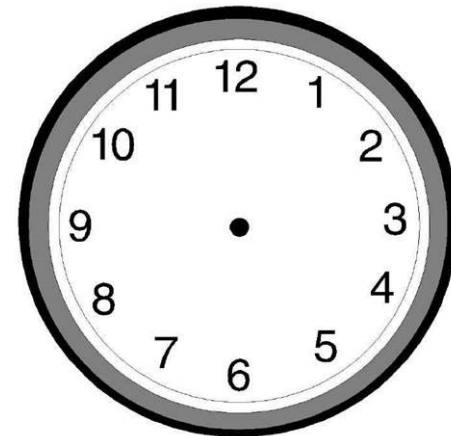
