

<p><b>Parts of Speech</b></p>	<p><b>Nouns:</b> Nouns are words that name a person, place, thing, animal, or idea. <b>Examples:</b> bird, house, pencil, tree, hospital, teacher, desk</p>	<p><b>Verbs:</b> Verbs are words that describe action or a state of being. Verbs are action words. <b>Examples:</b> run, laugh, cry, sit, listen, read</p>
<p><b>Adjectives:</b> Adjectives are words that describe nouns. They are called describing words. <b>Examples:</b> beautiful, smart, few, tall, wet</p>	<p><b>Adverbs:</b> Adverbs are words that describe verbs. They describe how, when, and why. Many end with -ly. <b>Examples:</b> quickly, quietly, softly, now</p>	<p><b>Pronouns:</b> Pronouns are words that take the place of a noun. <b>Examples:</b> he, she, it, you, him, her</p>
<p><b>Prepositions:</b> Prepositions are words that show relationships with other words. They tell where, when, why, and how much. <b>Examples:</b> to, by, at, under</p>	<p><b>Conjunctions:</b> Conjunctions connect a group of words to another group of words.  <b>Examples:</b> and, or, but, so</p>	<p><b>Articles:</b> An article is a kind of adjective that tells about a noun.  <b>There are only 3 articles:</b> the, a, an</p>
